Corvette club show attracts admirers

FLAGLER BEACH — It was difficult to tell which was more persistent Sunday morning, the falling rain drops or the Corvette owners wiping them off their cars.

An announcement was made that rain wouldn't affect the judges' scores, though the overall appearance of the car is what matters most.

"The judges score on if there are any paint chips and blemishes," said Bill Goff, in town from Scottsmoor for the 10th annual Flagler County Corvette Club show. "In the older stock cars, they check to see how worn the engine and lugs are."

It was the third year the competition was held in Flagler Beach. The show was rescheduled from October, when weather caused its cancellation.

Besides the 30 cars that belong to club members, there were 107 cars registered for the show, said show director Greg Norton and his wife, Sue. The owners competed in 14 different classes including stock, group by year, modified, custom and display.

Stock cars have to look like they just came off the assembly line and they are only allowed to have minor cosmetic changes, according to the class registration form. Modified cars are those with some light engine, body and interior work done to them. Cars in the custom class are allowed to have major changes.

Some cars are there for show only.

"I think they have two classes of modified — modified and super modified," said Goff, who was showing his 1969 Corvette.

Goff is the original owner of his car. He said he got married in August 1968, bought his first house in September and put his order in for his Corvette in December. He is still married to his wife, Catherine.

"When you get a good car and a good wife, you don't get rid of either," he said.

He has moved since buying his first house but he said he has kept the rest of his "originals."

The Flagler County Corvette Club was started in 1998 by a group of Corvette owners and supports many events in Flagler County.

Greg Norton said that the club supplies Corvettes for the high school's homecoming and other festivities. They also participate in the Christmas parades in Palm Coast and in Flagler Beach.

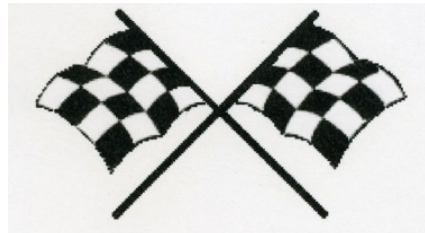
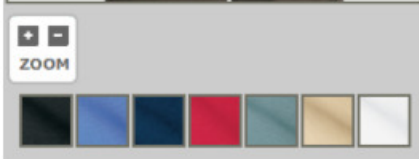

The fun T-Shirt is gray with black and red silk screened logos

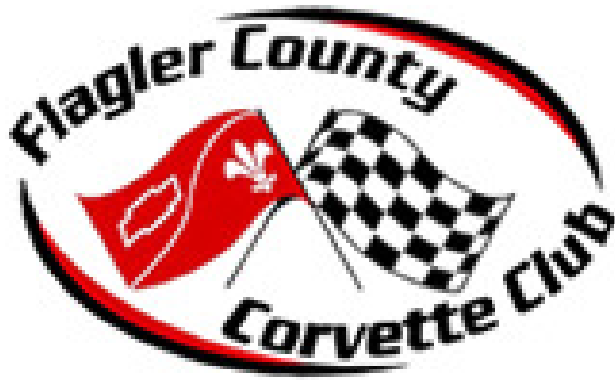
The price is \$8.00. It comes in women's and men's sizes. The women's shirt neck trim is narrower than the men's trim. Breast pocket is an optional choice.
